


Interesting Puzzle Facts

- The first-ever crossword puzzle was created by Arthur Wynne and ran in the New York World newspaper on December 21, 1913.
- Are you a dissectologist? That is a person who enjoys jigsaw puzzle assembly. A person who is involved in the science of puzzles is an enigmatologist.
- The fastest time ever solving a Sudoku is 1 minute 23.93 seconds. The record was set on May 20, 2006 by Thomas Snyder, an American Sudoku champion.

- Cool! The word ladder puzzle was invented by Lewis Carroll, author of Alice's Adventures in Wonderland.




What is a Puzzle?

/'pæzəl/

A **puzzle** is a game, problem, or toy that tests a person's ingenuity or knowledge. In a **puzzle**, the solver is expected to put pieces together, in a logical way or in a particular order to arrive at the correct solution.

Types of Puzzles



Word Puzzles: Puzzles that use language to challenge the solver.


Logic Puzzles: Puzzles that can be solved by thinking and using deductive reasoning

Number Puzzles: Puzzles that require numbers to complete


Mechanical Puzzles: Puzzles that manipulate a whole object or parts of it to get an answer.

Escape Rooms: Locked areas where you must solve a series of puzzles to get out

Informational Puzzles: Puzzles that test subject knowledge based on facts.
